WORLD DEAF RUGBY SEVENS CHAMPIONSHIP

On the first day, April 5, of the 2nd World Deaf Rugby Sevens Championship, the Opening Ceremony was held at the Mario Alberto Kempes Stadium, with the participation of all the authorities that supported the event, as well as the delegations who were present. The trophies, the participation medals, and a photo with the captains of each representative team, both from the female and male branches, were also presented.



The 2nd World Deaf Rugby Sevens Championship took place at the "El Bosque" Stadium, belonging to the "La Tablada Social and Sports Club" in the City of Córdoba. In the "El Bosque" Stadium, a series of matches took place on April 6, 7 and 9, where the matches stood out for

their intensity, plays, changes of rhythms and friction, but at all times, the good behavior and respect that existed among all the members of the teams that were present in the stadium, before, during and after each match played.



The participating teams, compared to the 1st World Deaf Rugby Sevens Championship, have increased considerably, managing to present 8 men's teams as well as 4 women's teams. The composition of the athletes (according to the ID photos that were requested by email) consisted of:
